



The ELCNF works with 400 childcare and pre-school providers. We serve 3,900 children monthly in our school readiness program which provides low income families who are working or going back to school help in paying for their child care. # Sandi's Corner

Story talk is a great activity for Reading Pals. Talking about what you read is another way to help children develop language and thinking skills. You won't need to plan the talk, discuss every story, or expect an answer.

What you'll need:

Storybooks

What to do:

- Read slowly and pause occasionally to think aloud about a story. You can say: "I
  wonder what's going to happen next!" Or ask a question: "Do you know what a
  palace is?" Or point out: "Look where the little mouse is now."
- Answer your children's questions, and if you think they don't understand something, stop and ask them. Don't worry if you break into the flow of a story to make something clear. But keep the story flowing as smooth as possible.
- Talking about stories they read helps children develop their vocabularies, link stories to everyday life, and use what they know about the world to make sense out of stories.

The goal of this conference is for volunteer readers to learn something new and to share ideas that will help improve their reading assignments.

# **ELC Days at Amazing Grace Crop Maze**





The ELCNF hosted two field trip days at the Amazing Grace Crop Maze in Green Cove Springs during the month of October. 21 pre-school attended for a total of 480 children. ELC staff and volunteers were on hand providing a special FALL craft and they gave each child a "Spookly the Square Pumpkin" book. Each school received an assorted bag of FALL books for their classrooms as well.

## Read For The Record 2018

October 25th was Read for the Record day. Each year a world record is attempted to read the same book on the same day to the most kids. This event is sponsored by the Jump Start and the Pearson Foundation. The world record was broken! This year 2,776,240 kids were read to. The ELC of North Florida participated by providing any of their child care providers who wanted a FREE copy of this year's book "Maybe Something Beautiful" along with an activity kit. 94 providers participated for a total of 6,541 kids read to.

During the month of November, the ELC outreach team launched its new Dinosaur themed program by putting on four different programs at the following locations: Geneva Presbyterian Pre-school in St. Johns, LaPatite Academy in St. Augustine, Children's World in Palatka and First Steps Learning Center in Fleming Island. During these programs children get to explore the world of dinosaurs through an interactive story time that includes music and drama as well as through hands on sensory activities. The children get to pretend they are Paleontologists while digging and making their own fossils. Each child received a FREE dinosaur book and the teacher received a bag of resources to further teach the dinosaur theme.

According to the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB), the value of volunteer services can be disclosed in a nonprofit's financial statements for grant proposals, annual reports and other purposes. FASB states that nonmonetary information, such as the number of donated hours or services provided by volunteers, can be helpful in assessing the success and long-term viability of a nonprofit. Using this hourly figure, an organization can put a dollar value on the community support that it receives in the form of volunteer work.
